... the oldest grave dates back to 1832 and the Cemetery holds many of the founding leaders of the Mimico and south Etobicoke area.



The Memorial Cemetery Garden was born of the Christ Church Mimico parish's desire to commemorate the illustrious history of our church and to restore the churchyard to a place of beauty and serenity.

As the garden matures, century old trees will blend with the extensive plantings of new trees, shrubs, perennials and carpeting groundcovers.



## ..UNIQUE URBAN SETTING

Nestled in the southwestern corner of Toronto, the Memorial Garden Cemetery is located in the small historical community of Mimico, . Public transit is found just outside the front gates, and we are next to the Mimico GO station.



With 150 graves, and space for 250 more, the new garden also includes 2 distinctive marble columbaria to complement a variety of final resting place needs.

## A BRIEF HISTORY

Welcome to Christ Church Mimico Memorial Garden and Cemetery.

This lovely garden was developed and constructed on the site of the 8th oldest Anglican Church established in Ontario (1827).

Church services were likely held as early as 1823 by Squire Gamble for the rowdy lumbermen who had no work on Sunday.

The land was donated by Squire Gamble and the first church was built in 1834.

Early pioneer families recorded in Church archives include Gamble, Fisher, Giles, Goldthorpe, Van Every, Murray, Noble and others.

All are buried here, as well as other prominent families including Horner, Arlidge and Greey.

In 2006 two disastrous fires destroyed the 3rd church built on this site and the decision was made to develop a garden here.

Today the Memorial Garden provides a unique urban cemetery for people who love this community and a peaceful garden for restful contemplation.
